SYNOPSIS

The mountain originated naturally, consists of sandstone and is millions of years old. It is piled up of various layers and vegetated mostly with mixed forest. Conifer dominates the backside. From a distance the tree density appears cohesive. It is only when one ascends the red mountain on secret pathways, one can see that the front is rugged and there are several terrace-shaped like levels, which are connected by narrow paths. Where the old dwellings were and the early raids took place, everything is very damp and dark. In the front near the new huts and in the center at Volker's cave it's rockier, less vegetated and thus drier and warmer. More red. The mountain stores the sunrays, but it is also the carrier of other energies.

The red mountain is a relative of Mars, the warrior planet, a huge orgone, secret force field generator, idea provider, source of signs, catalyst. Things happen here covertly. It cannot be a coincidence. Everything converges here. 4000 years. The war of the huts prevails.

Volker (65) has lived as a hermit in a scarp near the red mountain above a German federal highway for 20 years. He is convinced to have found a 4000 year old Assyrian city and excavates it against all odds. Ensuing from one reality, originates a fascinating web of many other realities.


KLAPPBOXFILME


